
## AQ26 - Arctic Activities

## **Polar Habitat Dioramas**



Create a frosty polar habitat diorama!

First, find a sturdy cardboard box. Cut off the top flaps and lay it on its side, creating wide, open space for your scene.

Paint the inside of the box with shades of blue and white to mimic the icy environment, a lighter blue for the sky and a mottled white and blue for the snowy ground.

You can even add crumpled white tissue paper or cotton balls to create a realistic snowy texture.

Now for the animals! Use LEGO bricks or plasticine to sculpt polar bears, penguins, seals, and maybe even a majestic walrus. For LEGO, consider using white and black bricks for penguins, white and grey for polar bears, and darker greys for seals.

With plasticine, you can blend colours to achieve similar effects and even add small details like eyes and whiskers. Add you animals to the scene and your polar habitat diorama is complete!

## Make it BIGGER - Animal Adaptations

Use this activity as a springboard to discuss what physical adaptations polar animals have to survive in cold and icy environments.
